




Map 1: Swindon's seven PNA geographical areas with ward boundaries



Map 2.1: Areas of deprivation by ward




Map 2.2: Areas of deprivation by LSOA within Swindon




#### Map 2.3: Most deprived LSOAs in England located in Swindon



Map 4 – Map of non-controlled areas<sup>1</sup>








Map 5.3: Fifteen minute walk (0.5 mile buffer) area from any Swindon pharmacy




Map 6.1: population estimates by LSOA, all ages

## Appendix 7: Draft PNA Consultation: Main Comments

Following the 60 day consultation period all responses were analysed and considered by the SBC PNA Working Group. Amendments were made to the draft document for clarity and accuracy as considered appropriate. The statutory consultee comments along with the actions taken (if necessary) are summarised below:
